Seniors are putting it all into reverse

SSET-RICH but cashpoor seniors are increasingly taking up reverse mortgages to help fund retirement activities, according to mortgage broker Loan Market.

Spokesman Paul Smith said more than 40,000 Australians hold reverse mortgages and a recent survey by accounting firm Deloitte found the take-up of reverse mortgages had grown by 22 per cent over the past two years.

"It is becoming more popular in the post-global financial crisis environment," Mr Smith said.

Reverse mortgages allow people aged 63 and over to use equity in a home or investment property to release cash.

"This is a lifetime loan with no repayments required until the property is sold," Mr Smith said.
